

Rec Center court rules

9 a.m.-2 p.m., Monday-Saturday: Open play, members and visitors

Players need to wear wristbands to show they have paid. As an alternative, a wristband may be placed on a paddle handle.

A board member or designee monitors the paddle box. The monitor pulls four paddles before a court opens and tells those players they are “on deck.” As soon as a court opens these four should move to it.

Players finishing a game should call out “court open” and make way.

Players are expected to have their names somewhere on their paddles. The paddle box monitor will not spend much time searching for owners of unnamed paddles. If your paddle has no ID, please be nearby and attentive or you risk missing your turn.

The paddle box monitor will decide when games will be played to 9, based on the number of players waiting (in general, more than 12 waiting).

When players are waiting, warm-ups on the court are limited to one minute. Players can use the too-short court for warming up.
